What do farm animals eat?



Chickens can eat plants and meat.
They eat seeds, fruit, vegetables and insects.




Sheep eat grass and weeds (wild plants).
When there isn't enough grass, sheep often eat hay or corn, too.

Rabbits need a lot of hay and grass, and some leafy green plants and fruit. They must only eat carrots as a treat because too many are not good for them.

Goats can eat anything – even paper and tree bark! The best food for them is hay, grass, weeds, and a little bit of corn and oats.


Donkeys are in the same family as horses, but they mustn't eat the same things. They can eat hay, but they need more woody plants, like straw, and shrubs and tree bark. They can have apples, pears, bananas and carrots as a treat.

Paint the clothes pegs and one side of the paper plate grey.



Cut some yarn and glue it on the head as hair, and on the other side to make a tail.



Draw the donkey's head on the card. Then, paint it grey, too.



To make a blanket, cut out a rectangle from the card and paint it any colour(s) you like. Then, fold it and glue it on the donkey's back.



When the paint is dry, fold the paper plate in half. Cut off one corner to make room for the donkey's head.



Pin both sides of the folded plate together with the clothes pegs to make the donkey's legs.



Cut out the donkey's head and glue it between the two halves of the plate, on the side where the corner is cut off.



Now, let your donkey stand on your desk as decoration!
