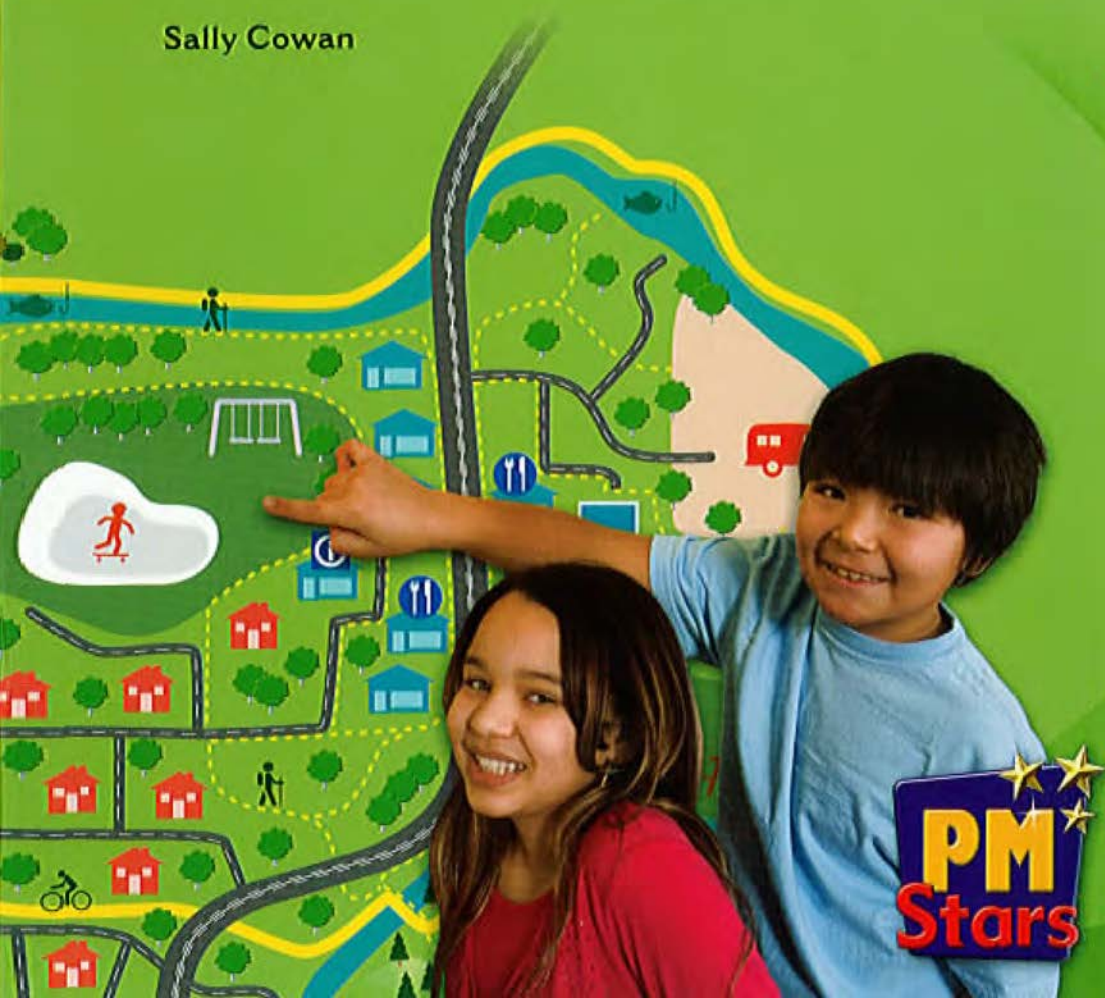

Key Teaching Points

- Talk about why people visiting Sunny Hill would find the map very helpful.
- Reinforce students' understanding that maps communicate information through signs and symbols.
- Clarify students' understanding of why the map has a key.

Key Questions

- What is a big highway? (*Inferential*)
- Why can people have a good holiday at Sunny Hill? (*Inferential*)

Word Study

- Locate words beginning with *sm*, *pl*, *sk* and *sw*. Use the books *sm*, *pl*, *sk* and *sw* in the **PM Alphabet Blends** series to identify other words beginning with the same sounds.
- Expand these compound words: *highway*, *playground*, *skatepark*.
