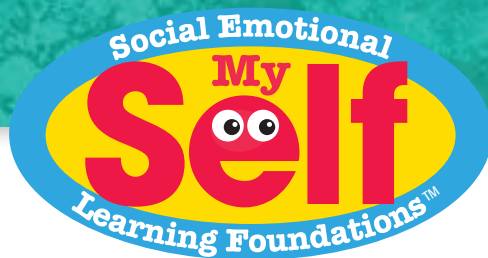


MOVE OVER, Please

SET THEME:

Build Social and Emotional Intelligence

Use the following tips to help children establish and maintain personal space:

- Discuss the reasons for everyone needing personal space.
- Play with friends without bumping or touching.
- Review safety rules:
 - Stand up carefully.
 - Look around before moving.
 - Move over slowly.

How to Read This Book with Children

- 1.** Read aloud the title. Demonstrate how to move over and create space to play.
- 2.** Read aloud the book with children.
- 3.** Talk about moving over to share space safely.
- 4.** Ask children to describe how Bo changes over the course of the story and uses kind words.
- 5.** After reading, use the Real-World Wrap-Up prompts to discuss the photograph.
- 6.** Guide children to connect the story to their own experiences.

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Mornings were very busy at Bo's house.



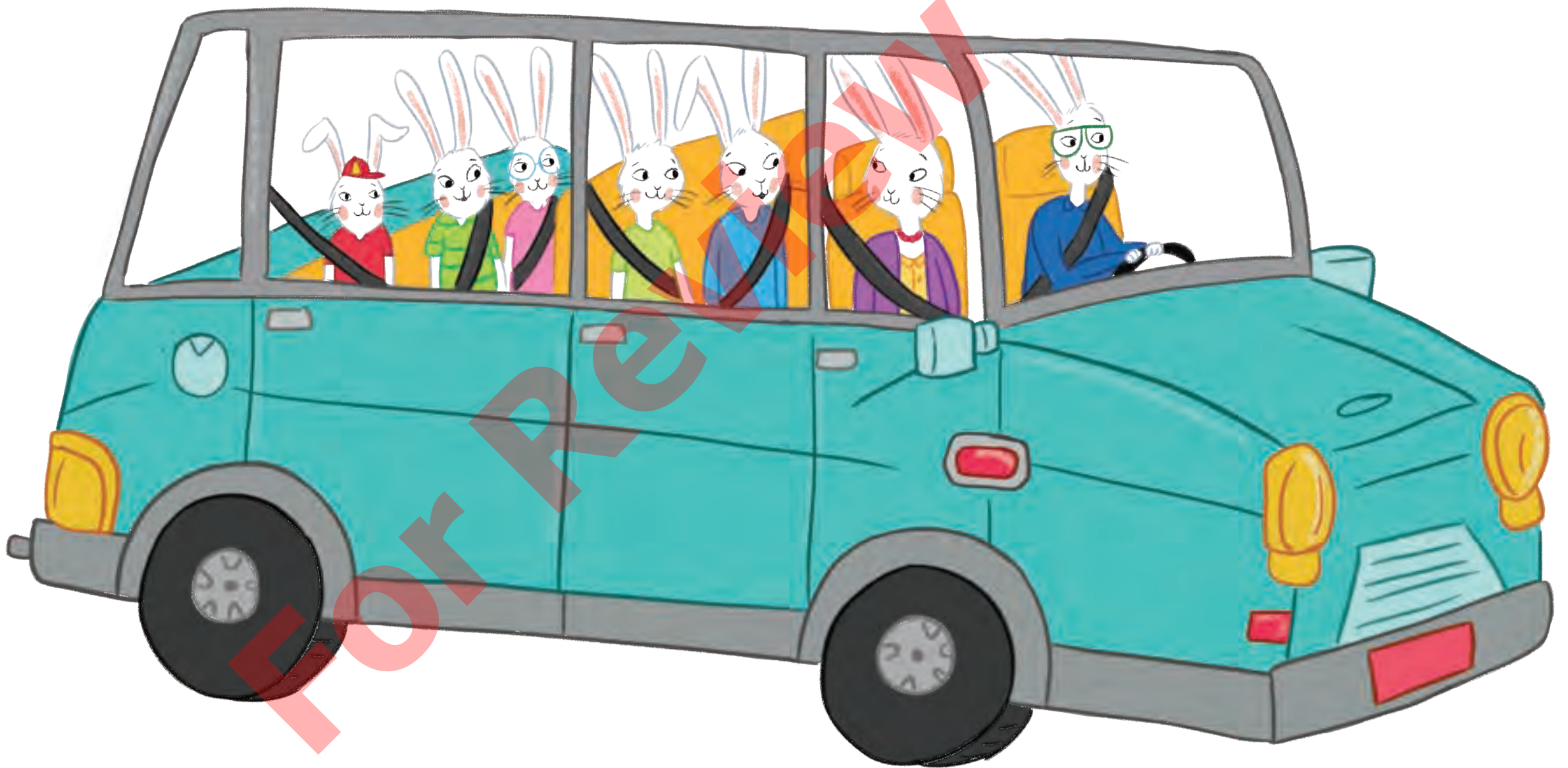
Bo and his family ***CROWDED*** together
