## **Ideas for Parents and Teachers**

#### **Before Reading**

- "Walk" through the book and point out the various nonfiction features. Ask the student what purpose each feature serves.
- Look at the glossary together.
   Read and discuss the words.

#### **Read the Book**

- Have the child read the book independently.
- Invite him or her to list questions that arise from reading.

#### **After Reading**

- Discuss the child's questions.
   Talk about how he or she might find answers to those questions.
- Prompt the child to think more.
   Ask: China has some of the most populated cities in the world.
   Are there a lot of people where you live?


