# Ideas for Parents and Teachers

Bullfrog Books let children practice reading informational text at the earliest reading levels. Repetition, familiar words, and photo labels support early readers.

## Before Reading

- Discuss the cover photo. What does it tell them?
- Look at the picture glossary together. Read and discuss the words.

## Read the Book

- “Walk” through the book and look at the photos. Let the child ask questions. Point out the photo labels.
- Read the book to the child, or have him or her read independently.

## After Reading

- Prompt the child to think more. Ask: There are many ways to show tolerance. How can you show tolerance today?

# Picture Glossary



## **accept**

To approve of someone without judgment and without wanting to change that person.



## **celebrate**
