Mrs Wonder is taking her class of superheroes on a school trip to a museum. But will they be able to keep their powers hidden?

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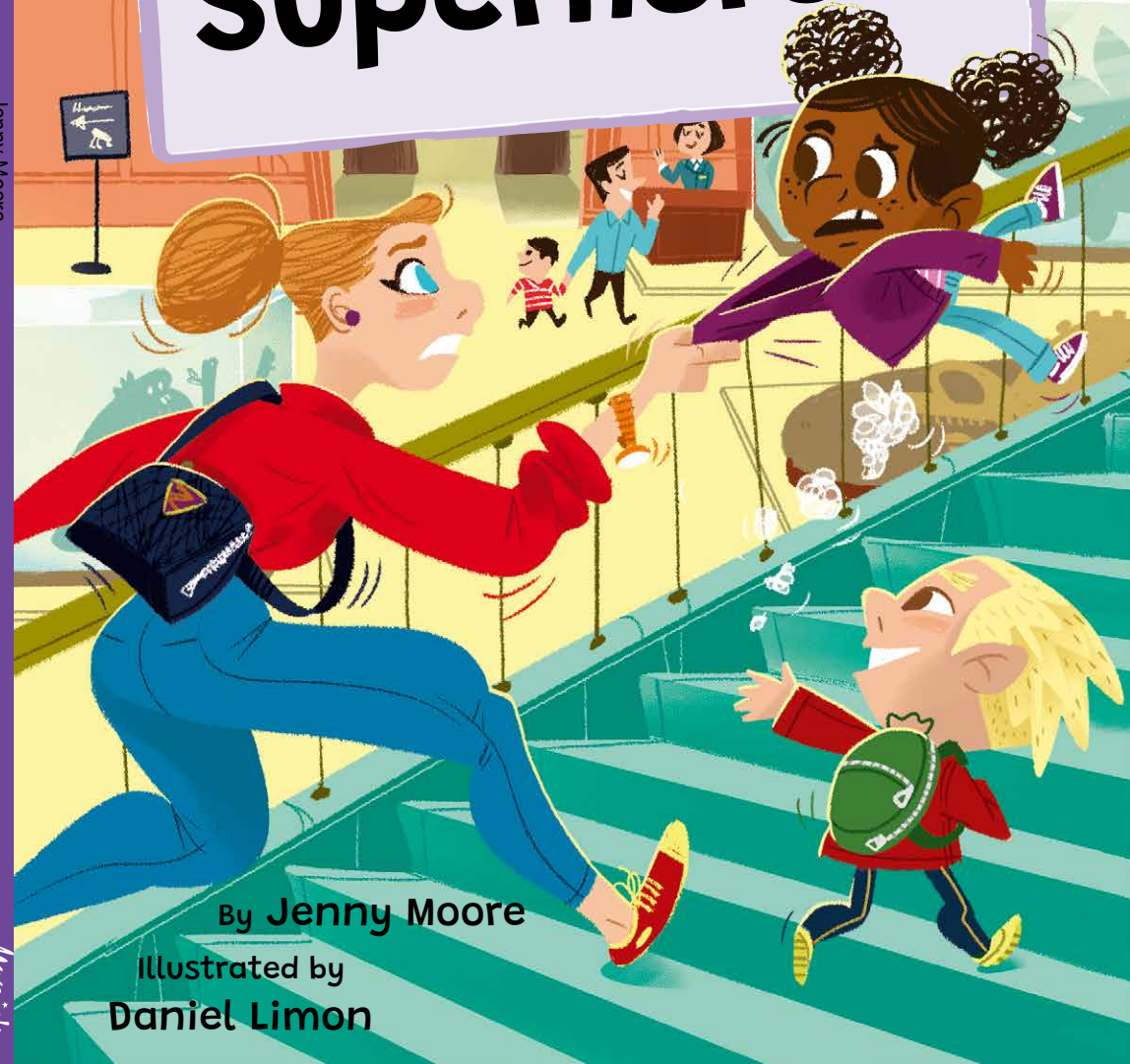
