Ugh! The giant's breath smelled like a hundred rotten fish.

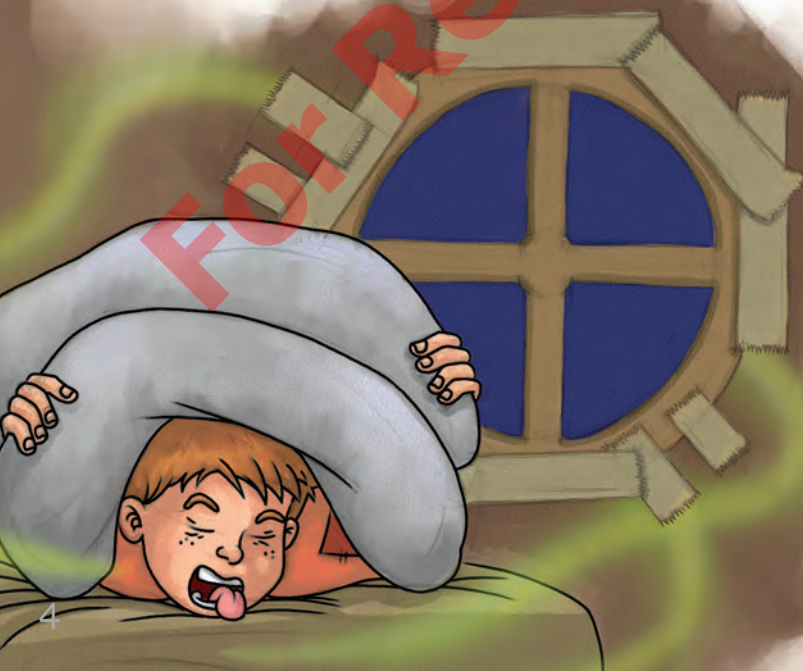




Henry tried sleeping with his head under the pillow. That didn't work either. The terrible smell crept under the pillow and found him.

"I must do something," said Henry as he made a bed inside the cupboard with the spiders.





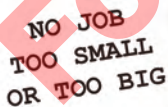
CHAPTER TWO
