

- A comedy set in the 6th century, when Hank Morgan, a Yankee engineer from Connecticut in the 19th century, finds himself back in the time of King Arthur, after being hit on the head.
- Twain wrote the book after dreaming about being a knight, and it's often considered an example of how to write a 'time travel' story.
- In the story, Hank tries to teach the people of medieval England what he knows to make their lives better.
- The book questions many social ideals and is a humorous satire of feudalism and the monarchy.
