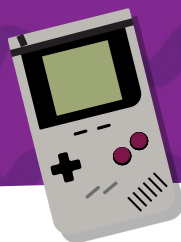

Before they can create a video game, **designers** need an idea.

Any idea can become a video game. Video game creators just have to figure out how to make it.



Concept Art

Once game designers have an idea, they think about what the game could look like. Artists make concept art to help.

A concept is a rough idea. Concept art shows how something could look. It often shows lots of options.





Some artists draw ideas for characters. Others draw the world the game might take place in.

Concept art helps the whole team understand what they are making.



Many video game artists draw concept art on tablets or computers.
